Ultrasound Technology

What Is It? Philips HDI 5000 Ultrasound System

Year Acquired: 2004. A \$100,000 grant from the C.C. Wilkins Estate allowed

the hospital-clinic to purchase this important diagnostic

scanner.

Uses: Ultrasound scans are used most often to detect blockage of

an artery that could lead to a heart attack or stroke.

How It Works: A gel is applied to the part of the body under study. The

technician presses a hand-held sender-receiver unit, called a

transducer, to the skin and sweeps it back and forth.

The transducer sends high-frequency sound waves and records the waves that echo back from internal organs, fluids,

and tissues.

The waves are measured and displayed by a computer, which

also displays the resulting image on a monitor.
